Closing speech for the Conference

**Rome, November 4th 2006
ESHA 10th Conference**

Ladies and Gentlemen, dear colleagues, dear John, thank you for handing the ESLN Program out to ESHA. It was an interesting and challenging time to work together with you and the consortium.

However this project is too precious to be laid ad acta after Rome. We can ascertain that ESLN is a highly successful pilot project. We now have to plan the future of this project:

In addition to the online version we made the necessary changes that allow for the use of the materials as an online course for self study or the use in institutes.

We decided to develop three new modules to complete the course:

- Module 4: Creating the Learning Centred School
- Module 5: Education Leadership and the Community
- Module 6: Educational Leadership in a Changing Europe.

Through these changes and in our future work

- We must reach all school heads in Europe.
- We should translate the course into other languages.
- We must interest European and national institutions to offer this course as a “training on the job program”.

- We should offer an official accreditation for the program.
- We should identify the program closely with ESHA and its members so that it will be part of the portfolio of services for our members.
- We should support further development and dissemination of the program.
- We should develop an entrepreneurial approach to marketing and disseminating the ESLN programme.
- We should develop strategies to extend the scope and content of the programme including the development of further modules.
- We must find partners for funding to finance the translations and production of CD's as well as promote the courses and the new modules as often as possible.

Ladies and gentlemen, dear colleagues

We are living and working in a time of big changes, and I think we are reshaping the plane while flying. There are strong winds from different sides. It will be decided in the next years in which direction the plane will fly and who will impose the landing place on the schools. The time has come for ESHA and all European school heads to oppose the development of the economising of our life and of our school. One of the important topics in the

Autonomous schools will work with accountability, achievement **and** responsibility, and the basis of our work has to be

Truth, Trust, Tradition and Time

- the four Big T's. For this I think we are not alone and we have and we will find strong partners. That's what I heard in speeches and workshops.

As everyone knows, preparing a workshop is a lot of work and I am sure, that many of you will take home a lot of useful information and stimulation for your schools.

In his time as General Secretary and than as President, ESHA integrated new organisations from Eastern Europe - a very important task in an expanding Europe to help school head organisations on their way to the European Union.

The dynamic development of ESHA in the last years was only possible because Antonino Petrolino steered the right course and prepared the new Executive Board for the future.

I would personally like to thank him for his loyalty, his support and his friendship and I hope that I can do, in the future for the new President Elect Chris Harrisson from NAHT in England what he did for me. At the end of this year after our last Executive Board meeting in Brussels in December, Antonino will leave after eight years of loyal duty.

Then we will say good bye at the very last moment in the Executive board but we will not say adieu -we will say Auf wiedersehen.

Ladies and gentlemen, we planned to publish the ESHA Members’ Book in Rome but we have not reached our goal to be ready for Rome. However, we can present

what we have finished up until today and you can see it in our slide shows during the conference.

But a single and unique print of this ESHA Members' Book will be handed out today to the Past President of ESHA, Antonino Petrolino, as a special thank for his dedication to ESHA for so many years.

Thank you very much Antonino and allow me to say thank you to Chantal, your wonderful wife. She did not only grant you the time for ESHA, she was often together with us and we enjoyed it very much.
